FROM THE SOUTH: Take Rte. 146 or Rte. 395 north to Rte. 1290.






By The Canal HISTORIC WALKING TOUR

he Blackstone Canal, which opened for business in 1828, provided a commercial link between the City of Worcester and the sea, at Providence. Although it was abandoned as a commercial enterprise 20 years later, it stimulated significant economic growth and left its imprint on the city's street network – as well as hastening the advent of the railroads and introducing an influx of Irish immigrants, who had been hired to dig the canal. Arched over and forgotten in the 1890s, it still flows beneath current-day Harding Street. The Canal District subsequently became the locus of myriad waves of immigration to the city, providing a first-stop home to numerous ethnic groups who later prospered and relocated – to the three-deckered hills to the east, and to the city's growing west side.


While no current-day buildings date from the actual Blackstone Canal era, the District is home to numerous properties that figured prominently in its aftermath – an age of vigorous commercial/industrial growth and multi-ethnic settlement.





